Concerns were raised regarding the language and the ambiguity of the proposal. Including it in the Constitution would produce significant barriers if any changes ever needed to be made. It was also noted that no reference to benefit plans be made in attempting to define those that fall into this category. | Draft Letter of Tenure Recommendations: <br> Joe Glover advised that he has composed a letter on behalf of Pierre Ramond, Chair of the Faculty Senate asking President Machen to endorse the Committee's recommendations. Recommendation \# 8 will be included in this as it was approved by the Senate at the $12 / 16 / 2004$ meeting. This will be submitted to President Machen formally. If he approves he will then send to the BOT and if they approve the recommendations will then be sent back to Constitution Committee for language and back to Senate for approval. |  |
