WE, THE STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA, HEREBY RESOLVE:

TITLE: Resolution Opposing the Minus Grade System

WHEREAS, studies of grade inflation and the effect of minus grades presented to the Faculty Senate remain inconclusive; and

WHEREAS, minus grades hurt students at each letter grade; and

WHEREAS, permitting faculty to "opt out" allows similar students to be graded on different scales; and

WHEREAS, this inconsistency will afford some students better Grade Point Averages than their peers without any additional effort; and

WHEREAS, students with lower Grade Point Averages are less competitive in the post-graduate and job markets; and

WHEREAS, minus grades will impact retention rates, graduation rates and scholarship eligibility including Bright Futures; and

WHEREAS, an increased number of grade distinctions exacerbates the problem of grade misclassification; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of minus grades at Georgia State University caused an increase in the number of grade changes performed by the registrar's office due to more student grade appeals and clerical professor errors; and

WHEREAS, implementing the proposed changes will cost the university to redesign computer software and change publication text including whether "C- or better" ought to replace "C or better"; then

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the students of the University of Florida firmly oppose the adoption of a minus grade system.
