RE: Proposal for a Ph.D. in Epidemiology

Your proposal for a Ph.D. in Epidemiology was approved by the Graduate Council with a starting date of Fall 2007 pending approval from the Faculty Senate, Board of Trustees and Board of Governors. After discussion, it was agreed that you would include the following as part of the approved proposal:

- Identify the core Graduate Faculty from all colleges
 Form a curriculum committee made up of faculty from the Colleges of Medicine and Public
 Health and Health Professions to review all curricular items intended to support this degree.
- There will be one concentration in Clinical Epidemiology.
 A letter of support from the library regarding availability of resources to support the degree program.

Once these changes are addressed, the proposal will be sent to the University Curriculum Committee as an information item and to the Faculty Senate for action.

As Health Science Center Libraries (HSCL) Interim Director and liaison librarian to the Public Health program and Epidemiology and Health Policy Research department, we have reviewed the epidemiology Ph.D. program proposal and believe current and expected future holdings are adequate to support the expected needs of students and faculty affiliated with this program.

The University of Florida libraries already have extensive collections and periodical subscriptions undoubtedly of use to students in the epidemiology Ph.D. program, including American journal of epidemiology; Cancer epidemiology, biomarkers and prevention; Epidemiologic reviews; Epidemiology; Genetic epidemiology; International journal of epidemiology; and Journal of epidemiology and community health (Journal Citation Reports impact factors on these titles range 3.003 - 5.068 and Cited Half-Life ranges 4.7 - >10.) Further, the University of Florida libraries contain almost all of the recommended epidemiology titles at the Essential and Research levels in the highly-respected 2006 update of the Medical Library Association Core (Public Health) Journals Project. The UF libraries also contain authoritative, advanced epidemiology books likely to be useful to Ph.D. level students, such as Fletcher et al's Clinical epidemiology; Friis & Sellers' Epidemiology for public health practice; Gordis's Epidemiology; Gregg's Field epidemiology; Koepsell & Weiss's Epidemiologic methods: Studying the occurrence of illness; Lashley & Durham's Emerging infectious diseases: Trends and issues; Rothman & Greenland's Modern epidemiology; and Rothman et al's Causal inference.

Most of the Health Science Center Libraries' periodical subscriptions are currently available online. We expect both our digital journal and book collections to increase. Understanding the importance of epidemiology to research in multiple disciplines at the University of Florida, the Library will continue to maintain its current holdings and expand its collection when warranted. Therefore, UF library system should be able to accommodate the students and faculty of the proposed epidemiology Ph.D. program within the context of its current resources.
