Baby Gator History

- 1969: "Baby Gator Nursery" established as a parent co-op
- 1979: Florida Statute 240.0952 mandated the establishment of "Educational Research Centers for Child Development" at each FL university to care for children of students, faculty and staff, provide internship programs and support research
- 2004: Name Changed to Baby Gator Child Development and Research Center; Logo trademarked

- Support professional development




Baby Gator's Goals

- Baby Gator shall support recruitment and retention efforts of UF by assuring availability of quality care for the young children of UF employees


Licensed Capacity

- 46 Future Gators/ VPK (4-5 years)


Capacity vs. Need

Wait List History



Impact of a Lengthy Wait List

- Faculty comprise 48% of Wait List Families (218 children, March, 2007)
- Faculty have access to 20% of spaces (26)
- Average Wait: 18-24 months
- In 2005
 - 27% of survey respondents rated child care availability "poor"
 - 36% rated UF's efforts to help faculty balance work and life as "unfavorable"

New Baby Gator Facility

- **40,000** sq ft
- 250 children, ages 6 wks to 5 yrs
- Mildly-ill child room
- Parent meeting room
- Observation rooms
- Faculty offices, classrooms, graduate/research work space
