Goals of the Crisis Response Team

- Coordinate the University's response to student emergencies;
- Offer counseling, guidance, and support
- To use incidents (when appropriate) as "teachable moments"

Definition of a Student Emergency

Life-threatening or serious situation involving **UF Students**

- Death of a Student (on or off campus)
- Attempted Suicide
- Life Threatening Injury/Illness Sexual Assault
- Mental Health Crisis 5.
- Drug/Alcohol Overdose

- Campus Disturbance/Riot 7.
- Contacting Students in Cases of Family Emergency
- Fire/Explosion with Injuries or Significant Damage
- 10. Natural Disasters
- 11. Infectious disease
- 12. International situations

If you are dealing with students in distress:

- Be aware of the location of the nearest telephone, whether it is within the building or a personal cell phone.
- If you are concerned for your safety or that of others, call 911 immediately.
- If the student is causing a disruption to the classroom or office environment but does not pose a threat:
 - o discuss the situation with the student to address the inappropriate behavior. o ask the student to leave the room.

If in doubt, call the UF Police Department!
