The meeting was called to order at 9:05 AM

The January minutes were approved.

Win Phillips discussed Responsibility Centered Management Budgeting (RCM), the new fiscal model for UF, and its implications for research. Since the decision has already been made to implement RCM at UF, the question is only which of nine models will be selected, and how to employ this budget model without jeopardizing research. Phillips congratulated the faculty for a 9% increase in research awards despite dismal financial conditions.

Brandy Boniface discussed the complex rules governing export control as they affect faculty and research. Export controls are governed by the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) and International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR). The problem is that violations can be non-obvious, but can nonetheless carry severe penalties for individual researchers. Examples include inadvertent web postings of restricted information, access to labs by non-US citizens, and small parts inside portable equipment carried overseas.

Jacob Chung reported on the Steering Committee meeting, including the Infrastructure Council's recommendation that a green team be established for each building on campus.

Matt Fajack, UF's Chief Financial Officer, will be invited to a future meeting to discuss how RCM can be implemented effectively to sustain and enhance research.
