### **The Largest U.S. Natural History / Anthropology Collections**

### Numbers from institutional web sites:

1) U.S. National Museum (Washington) - over 126 million items

2) Los Angeles County Museum - 35 million specimens and artifacts

3) American Museum Natural History (NY) - over 32 million specimens and artifacts

4) Museum Comparative Zoology (Harvard) - ca. 21 million specimens + "millions" of artifacts

5) FLMNH - 28 million specimens and artifacts (number includes 5 million @ McGuire) Add FSCA - 8.15 million curated + "millions more" uncurated....

6) Field Museum (Chicago) - more than 20 million specimens

7) California Academy of Sciences (San Francisco) - nearly 20 million specimens

8) Academy Natural Sciences Philadelphia - 17 million biological specimens

9) U. C. Berkeley - 12 million specimens + 3.8 million anthropological specimens

10) Yale Peabody Museum - 11 million specimens and objects
