The Faculty Senate Bylaws include the following description of the General Education Committee, as amended through May 6, 2010, on page 25.

"General Education Committee. The President shall appoint eight members to this committee from the majority of baccalaureate degree-granting colleges within the University, and the Senate will elect eight members from the faculty at large, and two non-voting student members selected by the student government. The chair will be elected from the committee. There will be an administrative co-chair appointed by the President. The General Education Committee establishes a philosophy of what constitutes the general education component for baccalaureate degrees offered by the University. It reviews, in accordance with established criteria, all courses proposed to fulfill general education and Gordon Rule requirements. It makes recommendations to the Curriculum Committee regarding the continued effectiveness of the general education program."

Requiring that the chair be elected from the committee presents logistic and administrative problems that may hamper the operations of the committee. It is normally expected that the Chair will handle the administrative responsibilities that are required for the efficient operation of the committee. These include communication with faculty in preparing submissions and handling individual petitions. The committee needs a Chair who has the time and administrative support to meet these obligations. In addition, the Chair normally chairs the meetings and is not usually expected to vote, whereas, senate representatives usually vote. Also, the current policy allows the chair and co-chair to be both administration members. This would result in the senate not having a leadership role in the committee.

In addition, the language needs to reflect the fact that the "Gordon Rule" has been replaced by the Writing and Math Requirement. In view of these considerations, I propose the following to replace the above policy.

Proposed Amendment

General Education Committee. The President shall appoint eight members to this committee from the majority of baccalaureate degree-granting colleges within the University, and the Senate will elect eight members from the faculty at large, and two non-voting student members selected by the student government. The chair will be elected from the committee appointed by the President or his designee. There will be an administrative a co-chair appointed by the President elected from among the senate representatives. The General Education Committee establishes a philosophy of what constitutes the general education component for baccalaureate degrees offered by the University. It reviews, in accordance with established criteria, all courses proposed to fulfill general education and Gordon Rule University Writing and Math requirements. It makes recommendations to the Curriculum Committee regarding the continued effectiveness of the general education program.
