1. Provide a short rationale for inactivation of the program.

The program was anticipated to fill a need for the Bachelor of Fire Science/Emergency Services graduates to continue advanced degree studies. The Bachelor of Fire Science/Emergency Services is growing but slower than anticipated (although it is a distance education program and requires less funding and resources than an on campus degree program). We anticipate with the additional three years it will begin to admit graduate students into the distance education master degree.

We have not admitted any students and have not started to admit students. No information for students is necessary at this time.
